- Child centred focus.
- Be a passionate advocate for children.
- Excellent time management.
- Ability to listen and observe non-verbal communication and behaviour.
- Excellent communication skills.
- Ability to work well under pressure and meet national timescales and other operational deadlines.
- To be able to plan, prioritise and evaluate your own work.
- Demonstrates emotional intelligence.
- Patience, kindness and honesty.
- Creative thinking.
- Flexibility and the ability to act on your own initiative where appropriate.

- Energetic and passionate.
- To be a team player.
- To be non-judgemental to all those you work with.
- To maintain accurate records in language that cares and follow required administration procedures.
- To share information accurately and sensitively with children, families, colleagues and other agencies.
- To use a range of social work tools including strengthening families, relationship based practice and restorative practice.
